Background

ALMA – which stands for ‘Aim, Learn, Master, Achieve’ - is an EU initiative¹ aimed at supporting young people who are not in employment, education, or training (NEETs). More information can be found on the ESF+ SI+ Initiative website².

Objectives of the ALMA Network

The ALMA Network was established on 28 September 2022 as the successor to the TLN Mobility Network, with the following objectives:

- to support Member States (MS) and regions launching ALMA calls under their national and regional European Social Fund Plus (ESF+) Programmes 2021–2027.
- to encourage more MS and regions to participate in ALMA.

The ALMA Network is organised and supported by the European Commission (EC) and the European Competence Centre for Social Innovation under the ESF+ Social Innovation+ Initiative.

Composition of Members

The ALMA Network³ consists of ESF+ Managing Authorities (MAs) and Implementing Bodies (IBs) at national and regional levels that are currently implementing or planning to implement ALMA measures under their national or regional ESF+ Programmes 2021–2027.

Ensuring members' involvement

The work of the ALMA Network relies heavily on the active participation and commitment of its members. With the support of the European Competence Centre for Social Innovation and the EC, the Network maintains an open and mainly self-organising peer-review platform and exchange network for MA/IB practitioners by MA/IB practitioners. There is a lot of experience from previous mobility projects or the former TLN Mobility Network that Network members can leverage, and a range of models for implementing ALMA mobility measures that can be adapted to local needs.

The Network follows a bottom-up and participatory approach by shaping the Work Programme based on members' needs (see chapter ‘Teamwork organisation and logistics’ below) and feedback. Members are actively involved in the planning, design, and content of meeting agendas, in four self-organised thematic sub-groups, work programmes or other documents, working methods, etc., and are encouraged to bring in their own topics.

The Work Programme 2026 is to be seen as a ‘living document’, which will remain open for further development throughout the work process.

Key Lessons Learned From 2025

Throughout 2025, the ALMA Network continued to function as a forum for the exchange of practices and implementation experiences at regional and national levels while progressively strengthening its strategic contribution. This development was reflected in increased engagement in policy learning and improvement, and in contributions to the strategic positioning of ALMA beyond 2027 in the next EU multiannual financial framework (MFF) 2028–2034. In line with its objectives, the activities of the ALMA Network focused on identifying challenges related to the preparation, launch, and implementation of ALMA by facilitating the exchange of common solutions across the following topics:

Finance/Simplified cost options (SCO)/Delegated Act:

Financial implementation remained a key area of focus, as the characteristics of ALMA’s target group and the diversity of national/regional implementation contexts highlighted the need for discussing working funding approaches. The Network addressed issues related to project budgeting, the eligibility of activities, and the exchange of implementation practices, including the use of the ALMA Delegated Act⁴, simplified cost options (e.g. unit costs), financing not linked to costs, real cost models, and mixed funding schemes. **An updated overview of ALMA funding schemes** was collected in the ALMA Network MS Teams Channel⁵.

Evaluation of soft outcomes

The ALMA Network initiated structured discussions on soft indicators based on existing evaluation materials and practical methodologies used by Network members. An **overview of methods and tools**⁶, with a particular focus on key criteria for assessing soft outcomes and on capturing participants' 'distance travelled', was addressed as a core element of ALMA's impact on the most vulnerable target groups. Despite national and regional differences, members agreed on the need for a common basic evaluation framework and shared tools to strengthen the evidence base, enable the collection of results, and support political communication.

Communication and dissemination

Communication and dissemination emerged as strategic priorities within the ALMA Network to strengthen ALMA's visibility, promotion, and long-term sustainability. The Network identified the need for clear target-group messaging for successful outreach and a stronger focus on communicating results to key stakeholders and a wider audience. Results are disseminated via the ESF+ SI+ Initiative website/ALMA Network section⁷ which was improved with the input and help of the subgroup. The ALMA Steering Group developed a **draft ALMA Position Paper** presented at the ALMA EU-level Call High-level event in December 2025 to reach a wider audience and to further encourage Member States to implement ALMA.

Most vulnerable NEETs

A clear **definition of the 'most vulnerable NEETs'** is essential for the implementation of ALMA, with a target group definition specified at national or regional level while remaining aligned with ALMA's core activities; clear inclusion and exclusion criteria are required to prevent creaming effects and safeguard ALMA's distinct identity. Discussions focused on social inclusion, outreach, motivation, and retention of the target group, including implications for project design.

Launching and drafting ALMA calls

The ALMA Network supports its members in preparing, launching, and implementing ALMA calls. It addresses concrete implementation challenges, drawing on experiences from regions with established calls and discussing ALMA specific guidance elements such as the overall framework, finances, timelines, application and selection procedures, project support mechanisms, and the definition of the ALMA phases. A **comprehensive overview providing key information on national/regional ALMA calls/projects launched** under national or regional ESF+ Programmes 2021–2027⁸ has been compiled.

Transnational cooperation

The ALMA Network confirmed the strong added value of transnational and national cooperation, while identifying the need to further clarify specific technical aspects, such as work-related learning experiences and cooperation agreements. The **integration of ALMA into the SIM Database**⁹ supported by a dedicated network subgroup following the co-design principle aims to facilitate to support structured cooperation between sending and hosting organisations. In addition, members exchanged good practices and implementation experiences, including on legal conditions and follow-up support mechanisms, to strengthen operational clarity and facilitate participants' transition to employment or further education.

A table listing ALMA Network events and outputs is enclosed **in the Annex** at the end of the document.

Results:

At the beginning of 2026, **eight Member States are implementing ALMA calls/projects** under their national/regional ESF+ programmes: Bulgaria, Germany, Czechia, Italy (Calabria), Malta, Slovenia, Spain (Andalusia, Catalonia, Galicia and Murcia), and Poland (Lubelskie, Podkarpackie, Śląskie, and Świętokrzyskie). The total budget dedicated to ALMA during the current MFF 2021–2027 is **EUR 174.7 million**.

The total number of NEETs that are/will be targeted through ALMA during the current MFF is **7966**.

Other regions and Member States, including Greece, Croatia, Italy (Emilia-Romagna), Slovakia, Portugal, Spain (Valencia), and Poland (Opolskie), plan to launch regional/national programmes¹⁰.

10 Planned ALMA Calls in EU Member States - SI+

With the ALMA EU-level call under indirect management, 28 transnational projects involving entities from 15 Member States (Austria, Bulgaria, Czechia, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Spain, and Sweden) were funded with EUR 11 million from the ESF+ and implemented between 2023 and winter 2025. These projects targeted around 800 NEETs.

Main Priorities for 2026 and Work Programme Activities

Based on the results of a survey and an interactive session during the 13th ALMA Network meeting analysing and discussing participants' needs (Brussels, December 2025), the following specific topics/work packages will be continued in 2026:

Depending on the subject, meetings can take the form of learning sessions/workshops, action learning sets¹¹, peer learning or peer-to-peer-training, study visits, etc.

Network members have expressed a strong preference for study visits involving different stakeholders such as participants, project operators, and companies, as well as interactive settings based on case studies, peer-review, and knowledge transfer, and more room and enough time for discussions during the Network meetings.

Further activities include the promotion of ALMA (information sessions) and links to CoPs, Erasmus+, and other EU initiatives to explore possible synergies.

Information will also be published on the EC's ALMA websites¹⁴.

Teamwork organisation and logistics

In general, the ALMA Network members remain collectively responsible in close collaboration with the Network coordinator, EC representatives, and the thematic experts for all decisions concerning the ALMA Network, the Work Programme(s), and all activities and meetings.

The European Competence Centre for Social Innovation and the ALMA Network coordinator will function as a secretariat and provide organisational and technical support for the Network's activities.

A Steering Group¹⁵ composed of the ALMA Network coordinator, EC representatives, thematic experts, and representatives of the ALMA Network, discusses regularly the progress of the ALMA Network's activities and collect valuable ideas and suggestions for the activities, reflecting members' needs and expectations. It also proposes adjustments, when necessary, with the aim of fostering stronger engagement and a sense of ownership among ALMA Network's members (see Steering Group guidelines).

In 2025, four thematic sub-groups — (1) ALMA Partner Search Database, now included in the SI+ SIM Database; (2) Communication/Dissemination; (3) SCO/Finances; and (4) Evaluation/Soft outcomes — carried out the activities. They have proven to be very valuable for deeper discussions and understanding of complex key questions. Thus, for 2026, an additional group focusing on 'target group and outreach' and/or 'the future of ALMA' could be useful, as these remain key issues.

The ALMA Network thematic experts will be responsible for preparing and revising Work Programmes, and organising Network activities (content, priorities, agendas, etc.) in close collaboration with the Network coordinator, EC representatives, Steering Group, and Network members.
